AMIS/Sudan Fact Sheet

- The USG spends \$1.3B annually in Sudan: ½ in Darfur, ½ in south Sudan

- The AU and UN have agreed on a new Force Commander (FC), Nigerian Army General Martin Luther Agwai. He arrived in June 2007, and has toured all camps.

- AMIS completed Darfur restructure from eight to three sectors.

- AMIS Rotation Plan Update
 - Rwandan battalion #3 of 538 troops is in progress (27Nov-4 Dec).
 - Nigerian battalion #3 of 3680 troops tentatively scheduled (5-16 Dec)
 - Gambia 196 troops tentatively scheduled (17-19 Dec)
 - Senegal battalion 538 troops tentatively scheduled (19-20 Dec)

- UNAMID transition set for December 31st, 2007. TCC list submitted to GOS and awaiting approval

US Contributions to AMIS 2004-2007

- a. Annual Contributions. Since 2004 and through 2007 the USG has contributed over \$407 million to the AMIS mission. By year these figures are:

2005	\$149.3 million
2006	\$175.0 million
2007	\$ 54.7 million

- b. Expenditure Categories. The annual USG contributions have been allocated to various categories of projects. Specifically:
